All entries for open competition are to be pre-registered by **Monday, July 12, 2010**. Mail entry form to: El Paso County Fair, Creative Arts, 366 10th St, Calhan, CO 80808. **Do Not** bring items at this time.

Entry fee will be \$5.00 per person for unlimited entries. Entry forms available at the fair office, at various craft shop locations and online at:

Please read all forms before completing entry.
These forms are subject to change from previous year.

1. Each exhibit entry tag will be labeled and entered according to the division, department, section, class #, and exhibitor #. Exhibitors are responsible to place entry tags securely on exhibits when dropped off.
2. Only ONE entry per exhibitor will be allowed **per class**. If you have entered one item in the designated class, you may not enter a like item under miscellaneous.
3. Items entered must be made by the exhibitor. Exhibit articles completed in the last 18 months as of July 12, 2010.
4. Junior and youth may compete in another age class, but not in both. Seniors, youth, junior and preschool must have age on entry forms.
5. Premiums and ribbons may be awarded for three places in each of the classes if the competition warrants. A champion and reserve champion may be awarded in each Section based on the 1st place awards. If there is no merit for an award in a class, a premium award will not be placed. All awards are placed at the judges' discretion. In the interest of uniformity and consistency, the following premiums will be awarded: **First Place: \$4; Second Place: \$3; Third Place: \$2**. Participation ribbons (no premiums) are awarded to all unplaced participants in the junior, kids and preschool classes.
6. All premiums will be available during scheduled payout times during the Fair (see #14). Children's premiums can go to a parent or guardian as listed on entry form.

7. Exhibits will be closed to the public at 9:00 p.m. each night of the fair.

8. New classes may be formed at the discretion of the Superintendent. Items incorrectly entered may be reasigned or disqualified.

9. In the case of a disagreement with placing or judging, a written protest must be submitted to the Superintendent and be accompanied by a \$15 protest fee within 24 hours of judging. The superintendent, agents and judges involved, review all protests.

10. The Fair Board, superintendents, and staff are not responsible for loss or theft of items exhibited.

11. All Creative Arts entries must be pre-registered by 3 p.m. **July 12, 2010**. No late entries will be accepted. Dates and times for acceptance of pre-registered Creative Arts exhibits listed below.

12. Pre-entered entries will be accepted at the CSU Extension Office, 305 S Union Blvd, Colorado Springs on Wednesday, July 21, 2010 from 10am to 1pm. **No baked goods will be accepted on this date.** Waiver form must be signed before entry will be accepted at the CSU Office. A parent or guardian must accompany children.

13. **All exhibits, including baked goods** will also be accepted at the Fairgrounds on Friday, July 23rd from 7am – 10am. Judging will begin at 12:30pm.

14. Premium Payouts will be available on Friday, July 30th between 1pm and 4pm. Pickup of exhibits will be 9:00 am – 2:00 pm on Sunday Aug. 1st **only**. Premiums will be available on this day as well. Exhibits and premiums not picked up by Sunday, August 1st, will be held at the Fair Office for 30 days **only**. **Any entry items or premium monies not picked up by the end of the thirty days will be forfeited.** Saturday, July 31st is the last day of the fair. Please see the schedule for more information.

Division 2 – Pantry

Department 201 - Food Preservation

Canned products must be packed in clean, clear, standard brand glass jars, sealed with new clean lids and rings. No paraffin. Label jar with product, date of canning, method used (water bath, pressure canner, hot or raw pack), the length of time processed, and your altitude. Use USDA rules. This has been a requirement since 1989. Contact CSU Cooperative Extension 636-8930 for current USDA processing recommendations. The entries may be opened at the judge's discretion. Specify on entry form if using Kerr or Ball.

*Uniform in size, natural color and shape. Liquid-clear and bright, covering food in jar. Must be water bath processed or pressure canned appropriate for the item and altitude.
